

The Lily Group Seed Distribution 2014-2015

Welcome to the 2014-2015 seed list, the forty fourth issued by the Lily Group. This year's List is a little shorter than last year's but the quality of donations is very high. Several donors have provided internet links to photos of their plants.

Our regular contributors have proved most generous once again. What is also encouraging is that several recent recruits to the Lily Group have contributed many rare seeds, some of these wild collected. As well as an excellent range of species seed, the choice of Division 4 North American hybrid seed is especially strong this year.

The price of seeds is now 60p per packet. The process of distribution is described on pages **28 to 30**. Seed contributors will be rewarded with 1 free pack of seeds for every 2 contributions of species lilies, and 1 free pack for every 3 contributions of everything else. This is subject to individual contributions being large enough to provide three or more packets of seed & free packets are limited to a total of ten.

The authorities in Australia & New Zealand publish lists of plant species, seeds of which may be imported. Members living in the United States must send a copy of a 'Small lots' import permit available free of charge at:

- 218 **D.N.A.H 15b x D.N.A.H.23** (D.N.A.H 15b is a *kelloggii* hybrid that strongly resembles *L. kelloggii* but the yellow nectary areas are slightly orange. D.N.A.H. 23 is an *L. parvum* hybrid in which the flowers open yellow, fade to a very light orange and then further fading takes them to pink.)
- 219 **D.N.A.H.12 x *L. wigginsii*** (D.N.A.H.12 is a very orange hybrid with yellow pollen and large spotting. It grows to about 90 cm/36 inches tall and the florets are larger than *L. wigginsii*, more the size of *L. pardalinum*.)
- 220 **D.N.A.H.16 x D.N.A.H.14** (D.N.A.H.16 is an *L. parvum v. hallidayi* hybrid with colours akin to the variety but with fully re-curved florets. D.N.A.H 14 is a *kelloggii* hybrid that darkens to a pink with an orangish hue.)
- 221 **D.N.A.H.14 x D.N.A.H. 23** (D.N.A.H 14 is a *kelloggii* hybrid that darkens to a pink with an orangish hue. D.N.A.H. 23 is an *L. parvum* hybrid the flowers open yellow, fade to a very light orange and then further fading takes them to pink.)
- 222 **D.N.A.H.26 x D.N.A.H.17** (D.N.A.H.26 has a light orange floret with a yellow heavily spotted face. D.N.A.H.17 has a very dark ox blood red floret with a yellow heavily spotted face.)

D.N.A.H.8 has crimson tepal tips and a yellow face with very heavy intense spotting. The florets do not fully re-curve.)

As many of you will know, Charlie Kroell has been a longstanding member & supporter of the Lily Group. He is also an important breeder of aurelians. This is the first time he has sent us seed from his breeding programme. This includes hybrids bred by Anton Mego of Slovakia whom Charlie considers to be one of today’s most avant-garde breeders of aurelians.

- 272 **Mixed Aurelian seeds** involving, primarily, as parents selected hybrids by Anton Mego & Charlie Kroell but including also ***L. henryi* var. *citrinum*** and ***L. rosthornii***. Expected phenotypical traits, varying among seedlings: ***L. henryi*** floral architecture, blended colouring, conspicuous papillae and bold markings, including some dark nectaries.

Donors may order up to 100 packets of seed. Non-donors may order up to 30 packets. The price of seed is 60p per packet.

Charges for packing & postage are:

- Members outside Europe £3.00
- Members in Europe but outside the UK £2.00
- UK members £1.00

Digital ordering

The digital form will be sent with a Word attachment which is the order form. Download this into **My Documents**, complete it and email it back to Pat Huff at

lilygroupseeds@gmail.com

When the orders have been filled, the order form will be emailed back to you. It now acts as a pro-forma invoice, confirming what seeds you have got and how much the total cost is.

Postal ordering

1. When ordering by post, please print your name & address clearly on the order form provided and order by number only, in numerical sequence. Orders that are difficult to read or do not follow the above procedure will have to be put aside to be dealt with as time permits.
2. If you have an email address, please enter this on the order form. This will make communication easier should any query arise.

General points for ordering

1. Please do not order more than a single packet of any one item in the list.
2. Most seeds packets will only be numbered and not labelled with the name of the seed. It is important, to retain your copy of the list to identify your seeds.
3. Seeds will be sent in padded envelopes. Please do not enclose an envelope with your order.
4. Bulblets and bulbils cannot be sent outside of the European Union.
5. Members resident in the USA are reminded that they must supply a copy of their import permit and address label issued by USDA. Also, USDA restrictions limit imports to a maximum of 50 packets of seed.
6. **Orders will be accepted up to the 14th of March 2015, and all orders will be despatched by the end of that month.**

Payment

Please note seeds will only be sent out once payment has been received.

PayPal is our preferred method of payment for seeds. **It is not necessary to have a personal PayPal account in order to make an online payment.**

Payment may also be made by cheque, payable to **The Lily Group**. If paying by cheque, please write “Not to exceed” with the amount between the cheque crossing; alternatively, please provide a lengthy list of substitutes.

Payment by credit card is not available.

Substitutes
